What I've Learned About Judging

The Indiana Supreme Court is the ultimate adjudicator of all questions of Indiana law and, for state courts, of questions of federal law to which the U.S. Supreme Court has not spoken. Justice Frank Sullivan, Jr., in his first comprehensive discussion of the Court's work since his retirement in July, will assess the Indiana Supreme Court's jurisprudence during his near-two decades of service and describe the evolution of his own decision-making techniques. His assessment will include the Court's most significant decisions and the way in which they have shaped the law's development in our state.



Frank Sullivan, Jr.

Justice Sullivan served as a Justice on the Indiana Supreme Court from 1993 until his retirement in 2012. Upon retiring, Justice Sullivan was named Professor of Practice at Indiana University's Robert H. McKinney School of Law in Indianapolis. During his tenure on the Indiana Supreme Court, Sullivan authored approximately 500 majority opinions in a wide range of criminal, civil, and tax law cases and was also active in the Court's administrative work where he chaired its multi-million dollar technology initiatives.
