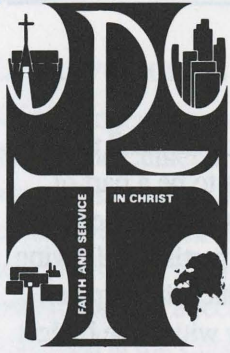

**Responsibilities:** Directs the Friendly Center, an ecumenical seniors' program (300 members) that meets weekly at St. Mary's Lutheran Church, coordinates the volunteer program for the parish, leads Bible studies, and does nursing home and shut-in calls.

**Quote:** *My calling as a deaconess is to work with seniors. Here at St. Mary's I have daily contact with seniors and that is the part of my ministry that gives me the greatest joy.*

## From my perspective . . .

It's not just a new look. The change in format of this newsletter is a sign of changes that have been taking place quietly here at the Lutheran Deaconess Association. Those changes reflect our renewed commitment to strengthen and expand deaconess ministry for the future.

We have reshaped our educational programs to respond to those students who want to combine deaconess ministry with social work, nursing, education, or music. We have developed new education/formation processes to accommodate an increasing number of second (or even third) career students.

We regularly work with congregations and other agencies and institutions who want a deaconess on their staff. We are exploring ways of providing better support to graduate deaconesses so that their ministries will remain alive and satisfy-

ing. (This summer we expect 150 deaconesses to gather at Valparaiso University for the annual deaconess conference. The theme will be "A Future with Hope: Diakonia for the 21st Century.")

We continue to offer programs and encouragement to the church's laity in their Christian service through our discussion series for mothers and the occasional newsletter *Diaconalogue*. New possibilities are on the horizon.

During the past two years we have examined our priorities and restructured our staff. The first step in our restaffing came in January as we welcomed Kristi Bangert as Director of Development and Public Relations. Kristi comes with a rich understanding of the church and its mission. She has a strong appreciation for deaconess ministry, and she has the skills and knowledge we need to tell our story

more effectively and to invite others to be a part of this ministry. (By the way, Kristi's expertise is allowing us to produce this expanded newsletter within the budget of our old newsletter by using desktop publishing and changing some of the ways we print and mail the newsletter.)

This summer we hope to be fully staffed again when we welcome another deaconess to the staff to work with me in services to deaconesses, students, and laity.

We look forward to the future. For nearly 75 years people like you have made the LDA possible. We are very grateful. We count on your support to help the dreams for the future take shape as we share Christ's love in a hurting world today and tomorrow. ■

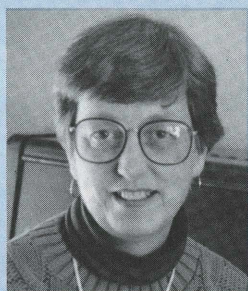

## New students begin *Plan 4* program

**Sharon McDonald**, Ashland, Kentucky, is on the pastoral care staff of a hospital; **Mary Phillips**, Peoria Illinois, works part-time in her church and community as an advisor to HELP-MATES, a singles group; **Judy Schroeder**, Orion, Illinois, has worked as a sales manager and most recently for the Girl Scouts of America; and **Jean Warren**, Round Rock, Texas, is a social worker for Lutheran

These four women are the new students in the LDA's *Plan 4* program this year. They are preparing to become deaconesses.

*Plan 4* is the LDA's education/formation program for non-traditional students--usually women with lengthy volunteer experience who cannot leave their home communities to enroll in college full time, but who have the gifts and the spirit of

*diakonia*. They complete their training locally, under the guidance of nearby deaconesses, with several week-long sessions each year at the Center for Diaconal Ministry in Valparaiso.
