ENTOMOLOGICAL NOTE

FIRST REPORT OF THE LEAFHOPPER GRAMINELLA FITCHII FOR MICHIGAN (HOMOPTERA: CICADELLIDAE)

While working on a leafhopper project I came across four specimens of *Graminella fitchii* (Van Duzee) in the Entomology Museum, Department of Entomology, Michigan State University, and five specimens in the Museum of Zoology, The University of Michigan. This is the first report of this species in Michigan and brings the total number of species of leafhoppers recorded from the state to 228 (Taboada, Great Lakes Entomol. 12:99–100, 1979).

This species is found in moist habitats and is common in the eastern states, ranging west to Kansas and north to Ontario (Bierne, Canadian Entomol. Supp. 2:1–180, 1956. Delong, Illinois Nat. Hist. Surv. 24(2):91–376, 1948). Michigan records are from Ingham, Lenawee, Midland, and St. Joseph counties.
